 - Proposal with preliminary thoughts to execution
 - Organize and possibly raise funds
 - Recruit and gather supplies
 - Direct others during execution
- Maximizing service is Not the objective
 - **Impact** has new importance for proposal approval and final evaluation
 - The learning objective is to plan, execute, and report a real project
- Scout creates the project
 - NOT the Parents or Troop





Where do I get a project?

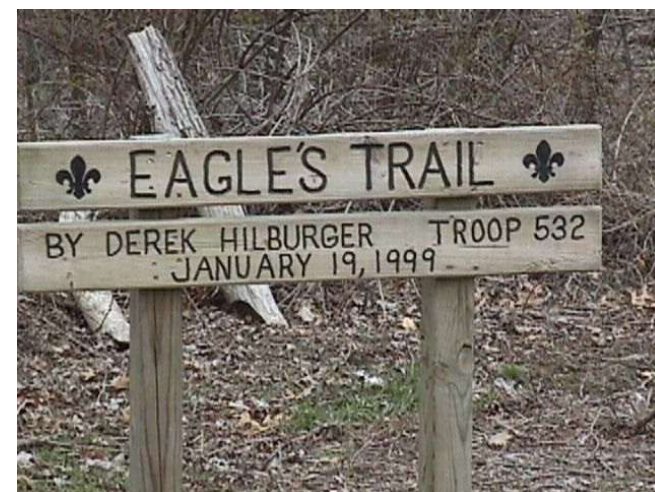
❑ Limitations

- ❑ Any religious institution, any school, or a community benefactor
 - ❑ Community now includes the World
- ❑ Not routine labor or maintenance
- ❑ Not associated with a business
 - ❑ Workbook Page 4 – “this is not meant to disallow work for **community institutions**, such as museums and service agencies (like homes for the elderly, for example), that would otherwise be acceptable.”
- ❑ Not a fund raising project
- ❑ Not associated with BSA activities/facilities

❑ Food, book, clothes, and toy drives must have specific goals and show impact





Where do I get a project?

- ❑ Parks: benches, shelters, signs, playground equipment, fencing, stairs
- ❑ Landscaping: Planting trees, shrubs, sprinklers
- ❑ Community gardens, raised beds, fencing
- ❑ Storage: sheds, bicycle racks
- ❑ Little book library boxes
- ❑ Animal shelters: Bird, owl, bat boxes
- ❑ Trail improvements and additions
 - ❑ **Not maintenance**
- ❑ Fire mitigation – collect, cut, drag, chip
- ❑ Flags: poles, installation, retirement
- ❑ Schools: Refurbish computers, clean out lockers
- ❑ Churches: painting, retaining walls, ramps, gardens
- ❑ Elderly: handrails, ramps, picnic tables, planter boxes, snow removal
- ❑ Hunger: Food banks, Colorado Feeding Kids, packaging





Where do I get a project?

- ❑ Individuals (or Relatives)
 - ❑ Requires a source representing the “community” who will provide approvals – Special needs cases are considered
- ❑ City Recreation/Parks Managers
- ❑ Schools
 - ❑ Windy Peaks
- ❑ Church Projects
 - ❑ Landscaping, painting, construction
- ❑ Historic Parks or Museums
- ❑ Federal or State Offices
- ❑ Senior Citizen Organizations (Not Individuals)
